Battisford Parish Council

As I write this report in mid-October, I am minded that British Summertime ends in only a few days and 'putting back' the clocks brings the real feelingof winter. And, Christmas is only two months away.......

It has been a relatively quiet summer in the parish- our second litter pick of the year took place on Sunday 12 October and thanks are due to those who assisted. We are seeing a gratifying trend of less litter being collected, though this is possibly down to residents who litter-pick on a regular basis, so, if that's you, thank you.

On a less positive note, residents have reported to us a greatly increased amount of dog poo – both unbagged and bagged- that is evident throughout the village. Clearly, this is both highly distasteful, and a health hazard. There are a number of dog waste bins through the village, so, if you are a dog owner or walker, please: pick it, bag it, and bin it!

The Parish Council has welcomed two new Councillors- Eleanor Newman joined us in July, and, following Steve Greenwood's resignation, Ben Ince has very recently stepped into the breach! We were sorry to see Steve leave, and thank him for his enthusiasm and support.

Many residents have commented favourably on the roadside 'white gates' that have been recently installed in Combs. Several months ago, we agreed to obtain quotes for installation of white gates by our village green in the hope that motorists will recognise they are entering a 30mph limit. And slow down! We will progress this in November, and recognise the constant support of both our County Councillor (Kay Oakes) and District Councillor (Dan Pratt) in this and many other matters.

We are seeking also to undertake remedial work to, and improve, the parish cemetery gates and reinstate headstones that have become unsafe.

Clearly such improvements aren't without cost, but our budget forecasting allows for these necessary works; we aim always to achieve best value and prioritise safety issues.

In November we will survey the trees at the village green and, over the winter months, a small number will be selectively felled to ensure safety and open up the understorey to improve the general health of the area and improve biodiversity. There will be occasions when areas of the green will be closed to enable safe felling.

We are exploring more effective ways to provide information and communicate within the parish and are always open to comments, feedback and suggestions, so please feel free to make contact.

Much of our local social and physical infrastructure (Village Hall, Punch Bowl Inn, local faith groups, Gardening Club, local inclusivity initiatives) is promoted and maintained by a handful of hard-working and motivated individuals- things don't magically happen! If you can help, in any way, please reach out and help support your community.

- Spring Bulb Planting in various locations around the village, including around village sign, PC noticeboards, grass triangles & verges
- White Picket "Gates" to enhance the entrance to the village.
- Signboard showing footpaths, benches, amenities, historic interest
- Picnic table and bench on Moats Tye/ Tannery Road Triangle

The Parish Council approved these and provided a bit of extra financial support and off we went!

We hope you are pleased with the results. Of course the bulbs won't be seen until the spring but we are hoping that these will give us all a bit of cheer after the winter.

Dear Residents

Isn't our Parish a glorious place to live at this time of year? Well, it is when there's a bit of sunshine around to highlight the Autumn colours that seem to encompass every shade of yellow, red and their combinations in the palette. We must also thank our local landowners who have been busy cutting back hedges and clearing out ditches as they do every year, keeping the place pleasant, tidy and fresh. Their efforts also helped with our most recent litter pick as we were able to get stuck in without hindrance.

You may also have noticed a few changes in our locale. The 'Pride in Combs' team led by Anna James has installed some white gates at the entrances to Combs, a new picnic bench up by Moats Tye and a splendid map by the bus shelter at the heart of the network of pathways in the village. There'll be additions over the next year or so and the guys deserve a big 'well done and thank you'.

On a less positive note, your parish council has taken the decision to postpone work on our Neighbourhood Plan for a couple of reasons. First, the grants formerly available to support this work have been removed. The council could pay for it but only if it there was a clear desire by residents to do so. Secondly, it's unclear where the Local Government Reorganisation will end up and there's no guarantee that a Neighbourhood Plan would carry the same legal force in the future as it does now. As a group we don't much like rowing back on what seemed like an excellent idea a few months back but we are where we are.

Finally and with no little sorrow we say goodbye to Hannah Larsen who has decided to step down as a councillor. We thank her for the smartness, diligence and integrity she brought to the role. Her leaving provides a further vacancy for socially minded folk to join us: if you'd like to find out more do please get in touch with our clerk Suzanne Ottewell or me.

Winter Commemorations and Celebrations at Little Finborough Church





St. Mary's Battisford

Thank you to everyone who contributed to the Stowmarket Food Bank through our Harvest Festival Service in October, and to Claire for arranging Doreen's amazing dahlias.

The second Sunday in November (9th) is Remembrance Sunday and, as in previous years, our service of Holy Communion will move to 9.00 a.m. It will be followed by the Service of Remembrance, beginning at 10.45 a.m. at the Wear Road, Ringshall, British/American Memorial. Parking is through Gate 3 on the airfield perimeter track, as directed. The names of Battisford villagers lost in WW1 (as recorded in the Church) will be read out. We were a "Thankful Village"in 1945 as all our parishioners who went to serve their country, came home.

In December we have our usual service of Morning Prayer on 7th at 11.00a.m. and Holy Communion on 14th at 11.15a.m.

"Carols by Candlelight" will be held at 5.00 p.m. on 24th – this year Christmas Eve falls on a Wednesday--- and, as ever, we will be delighted to welcome you all.

On Saturday 13th December we hold our Christmas Fair in the Punch Bowl from 9.00 a.m. and would welcome any donations of cakes, biscuits, decorations, suitable gifts, items for the draw or tombola.....or indeed, anything Christmassy!!

Caroline will have fresh wreaths for sale as usual and, if you are pre-ordering, would be grateful for numbers by 1st December (07547943160). They will be in bio-degradable Oasis again, which raises the cost slightly but is more ecologically sound....and we are an eco-church!



A visitor recently enquired why St, Mary's Battisford has but one bell, when several surrounding churches have a peal. Battisford Church has just a small bell gable (where jackdaws nest annually!) but once had a proper substantial tower. This sadly collapsed, probably in the very late eighteenth century, after which the west wall was repaired with its strange stepped buttress.....very unusual, and probably "made up as he went along" by a local craftsman. In 1553 there were three bells recorded in the tower, but, by the 1700's, one was cracked and the Bishop of Norwich (we were in his Diocese then) granted a faculty for two bells to be sold and the proceeds used in the parish.

The existing bell was cast in 1666 by John Darbie, bell founder in Ipswich and presumably survived the fall, as did the two gargoyles incorporated into the fabric of the South Porch step. We ring our solo bell slowly and respectfully for funerals and quickly (and hopefully more joyfully) for weddings, to celebrate national occasions such as V. E. Day, the Coronation and the passing of Queen Elizabeth II. We also join in, at a pre-arranged time, when bells are rung country-wide in celebration or commemoration. When our original bells were hung they had various functions. Summoning parishioners to services, of course, but also announcing a death in the village, different patterns revealing "man, woman or child", followed by tolling the number of years of their life. In addition the clamour of bells was widely believed to protect the village from the forces of evil. A typical bell inscription: "the sound of this bell vanquishes tempests, repels demons and summons men" and "This to ward off lightning and tis I who dissipates thunder" superstitions left from pagan times but embraced by Christians "just in case"!

We are always looking for new volunteers. The following activities are coming up if you would like to try something new:




- On alternate Thursday mornings there will be the opportunity to learn how to transform old tools by sharpening and resetting traditional carpenters' saws.
